Course outline

The animal management sector is constantly expanding and evolving. As such there is an increasing demand for individuals with good communication and management skills and the ability to critically analyse. The course enables students to develop knowledge relating to a wide range of species as well as developing skills suitable for supervisory roles with this sector.



Entry requirements

You will need either the National Diploma in Animal Management with a minimum of three merits, or three A Levels at grade C or above in subjects suitable for the course content.

Course content

You will study 18 units over the two year course including animal husbandry, nutrition, anatomy and physiology, animal health and welfare, biological principles, production animal management, behavior, wildlife management, management of animal collections and an investigative project.

You will also be required to undertake duties and industry related placements as part of your course.

Assessment methods

Assessment is carried out in a variety of ways including presentations, report writing, examinations and practical based assessments.

Progression opportunities

You may top up your HND and progress onto the second year of an Animal Management degree course.

Career opportunities

A wide range of career opportunities are available including posts within research and education and supervisory roles.
